The Victorian Government has published a discussion paper, which outlines a number of possible additions to its apartment design guide, with a focus on the way new developments relate to the existing environment. The Better Apartments Design Standards, which covered a range of controls including building setbacks, room sizes, natural ventilation and private open space, was released in 2016 and came into effect in 2017 .
