G.M. Gilbert was a U.S. Army psychologist, who had 24/7 access to the top brass of the first Nuremberg trial--Goering, Strasser, Speer, von Pappen, von Ribbentropp, to name a few. Not all received the death sentence, although Goering managed to cheat the hangman with a cyanide capsule, the day of or the day before the scheduled hanging, something well known to students of the Third Reich and the Second World War.
